



T.V. and Radio Policy

The Parklangley Club has the benefit of four TV screens within the bar area. Two screens are predominantly used for member information such as kitchen menus and drink lists and general event marketing, but not exclusive for this purpose. These are situated at the sides of the bar and are smaller. The main two screens are situated on the front wall and are used predominantly for showing sporting broadcasts, but not exclusive for this purpose.

Television screens in the bar can be switched on during opening hours to show live sports programmes or events deemed in the interest of the Club members. Otherwise the screens should be turned off and background music played. Marketing material may be shown.

The Club will act responsibly to ensure age related events are only shown to the relevant audience and appropriate time.

Priority will be given to showing Tennis, Badminton and Squash sporting events. An alternative screen can be used to show other sports at the same time. This will be shown without volume. However, when important sporting events of national interest such as World Cups or UEFA cup, or Rugby etc are scheduled these will take priority. At busy periods all four screens may be used to show sport.

Match viewing will be displayed a maximum 15mins before the start of the game/match, and screens switched off at the end of play (*Trophy Presentations will be shown on those occasions*). A suitable radio station will be played. This should be no later than the bell signaling last orders at the bar.

The Club on occasions will operate a late licence in order to show special pay per view events such as Boxing etc. The Club reserves the right to make a charge in order to cover the cost of such events which require additional licence or booking fee.

Volume should be at a considerate level deemed by the Duty Manager so that the enjoyment of those not interested in sport being shown is not adversely affected. T.V and music volume should not be on at the same time through the overhead speakers.

The Parklangley Club empowers the Duty Manager to manage this policy on a day to day basis, and will ultimately have the final say.
